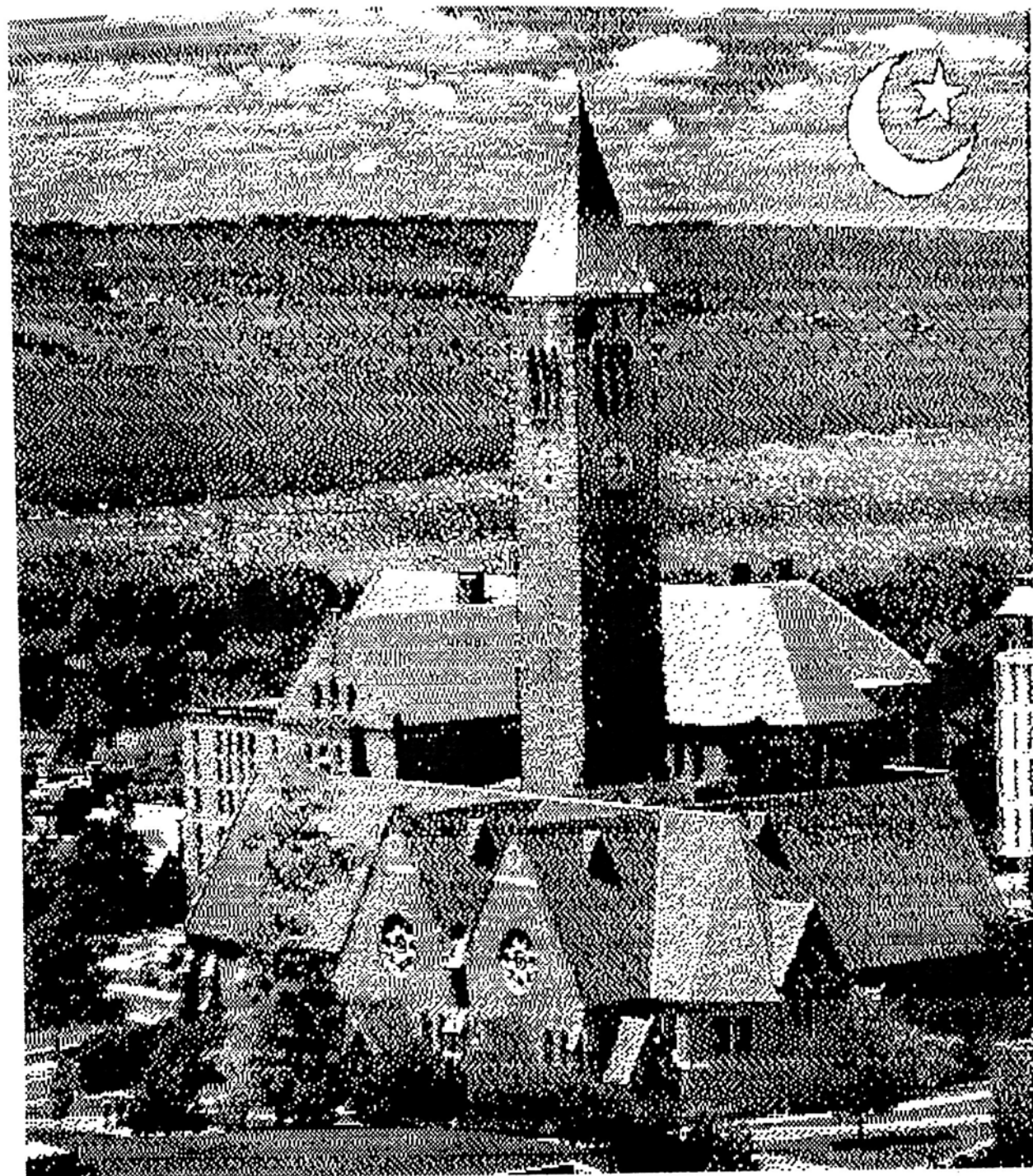

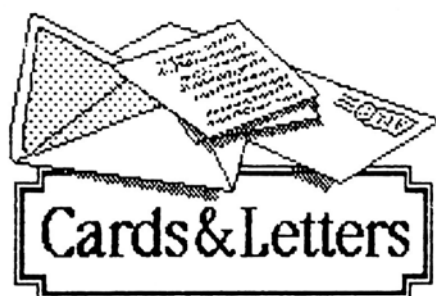
1989 Homecoming Bash
